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The Incommunicable Attributes of God: Eternity

The Revelation of God's World

The Revelation of God's Word

Scripture (Psalm 90; John 8:58) teaches us that God alone stands outside of time. While He can

experience time, His essence exists outside of it. And He has created us so that we will exist forever

The Revelation of God's Son

somewhere, in New Heaven-Earth, or Hell.

The Incarnation (God's Son uniting with human flesh in Jesus) reveals to us the wonder of an eternal God merging with time-bound human flesh. This means that Jesus exists within time. He experienced the normal stages of human growth (Luke 2:52). Jesus never sinned, but He probably had pimples, and knew what it was like for his voice to change. God knows what you face, and has made a way in the Gospel of Christ for you to eternally exist with the Father (2 Tim. 1:10).


